Farther is primarily an adverb. Further too is an adverb; but it is also used as an adjective. Both mean the same when used to refer to the concept of distance. However, there are some shades of difference in the meaning of these words and it is this that makes the speaker of English confused about the words.

The widely accepted rule is to use farther when being literal and discussing a physical distance, as in "He went farther down the road." Further is used when discussing a more symbolic distance or to discuss a degree or extent, as in "I wanted to discuss it further, but we didn't have time."

Farther and further both mean at a greater distance, and they are used interchangeably in this sense. In the United States, though, farther is more often used to refer to physical distances, and further more often refers to figurative and nonphysical distances.
