Children are born ready to learn a language, but they need to learn the language or languages that their family and environment use. Learning a language takes time, and children vary in how quickly they master milestones in language and speech development. Typically developing children may have trouble with some sounds, words, and sentences while they are learning.

The 30 million word gap between children in a language-rich home environment and children in a language-deficient home environment was identified in 1995, courtesy of a study by Hart & Risley. The study found that "the more parents talked to their children, the faster the children's vocabularies were growing and the higher the children's IQ test scores at age three and later".

Research on the importance of early language development

Language development in humans is a process starting early in life. Infants start without knowing a language, yet by 10 months, babies can distinguish speech sounds and engage in babbling.Some research has shown that the earliest learning begins in utero when the fetus starts to recognize the sounds and speech patterns of its mother's voice and differentiate them from other sounds after birth.
