Facts About the Ozone Layer. The word "ozone" means smelly in Greek because the gas has a strong odor. CFC molecules are highly stable and can last for up to 100 years. Unfortunately, this gives them plenty of time to find their way to the ozone layer. One chlorine molecule from a CFC

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can destroy up to 100,000 ozone molecules.

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
