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Modal verbs normally precede the main verb and provide additional information about the function of the main verb. The modals cannot be used alone and they always appear with a main verb. There are only a few modals that are used as helping verbs. Here they are: can, could, may, might, will, would, must, shall, should, ought to. Modal verbs are commonly used in sentences in passive voice. The form is similar to the form it acquires in respect of other verbs.

Passive Voices for Past Modals (e.g. MIGHT HAVE, MAY HAVE, SHOULD HAVE, OUGHT HAVE, MUST HAVE) Auxiliary Verb used in Passive Voice: BEEN. Active Voices Passive Voices: SHOULD HAVE. SHOULD HAVE BEEN. I should have started a job. A job should have been started by me. I should not have started a job.

Passive Voice Rules for Modals - All Modals

Let's see how to make passive voice of the sentences which have modal verbs in it. Subject + modal + verb + object. (Active Voice) Ex: She can cook the food. (Active Voice) (Here 'she' is subject, 'cook' is verb and 'the food' is object.) Subject + modal + be + V3 + by + agent. (Passive Voice)

Passive Voice of Modals Modals are special Helping Verbs. Modals express the mood of a the verb, such as ability, possibility, necessity or another condition. They are used with a main verb to form a sentence and it remains same whether Subject is singular or plural.

The passive voice is used when we want to emphasize the action (the verb) and the object of a sentence rather than subject. This means that the subject is either less important than the action itself or that we don't know who or what the subject is. My laptop was stolen. (The object - now the subject = My laptop / action= was stolen)

Passive voice for Past Modals"MAY HAVE, MIGHT HAVE, SHOULD HAVE, MUST HAVE, OUGHT TO HAVE". The places of subject and object in sentence are inter-changed in passive voice. 3rd form of verb (past participle) will be used only (as main verb) in passive voice.

Modal Auxiliaries and Passive Voice : Several auxiliary verbs are used to form verb-phrases indicating ability, possibility, obligation or necessity. Such verb-phrases are called potential phrases, that is phrases of possibility. The auxiliary verbs used in potential phrases are may, can, must, might, could, would and should.

The Passive Voice in English: In the "normal," active voice, the subject of the sentence acts upon an object: She snubs him. Both German and English offer an alternative verb structure, the passive voice, in which the subject of the sentence receives the action: He is snubbed by her. To transform the active to the passive, we turn the direct object "him" into the grammatical subject "he" and ...

Modal verbs can be combined with the passive voice in Spanish, the same way as in English, e.g "He should be put in prison" or "I had to be taken to hospital." The modal verb is conjugated in the required tense and then followed by "ser" + participle (agreeing with the subject). For example: Deber (must/should)
