If planting cannot take place earlier than six weeks before the expected date of the first hard frost, then postpone planting until spring. If the wetland will receive wastewater prior to planting, spread mulch two inches deep over the gravel bed. Select mulch that will not contaminate the wetland with undesirable weed species.

Drainage can be improved by planting on a slight slope, raising beds or planting in raised mounds of soil. For the enthusiast, we recommend a soil mix of 2 parts sandy loam, 2 parts peat and 1 part sand. Some varieties, such as the Double Tiger Lily, are a little less fussy about soil type. For growing in pots, use a bulb-specific potting mix.
